For Family, Feathers & Rum

I have just returned from a holiday to the island of St Lucia which is part of the chain of islands called the Lesser Antilles. The lower end of this island chain is also known as the Windward Islands. You virtually cannot get further away from Australia if you tried – the globe has a circumference of 40000 klms and St Lucia is 18000 klm from Australia.

My brother settled there over 25 years ago to take up a role as a Sales & Marketing Director for the local rum distillery. My mother has also now retired to the island as London was getting too cold for her. Therefore, this was a chance to catch up with family, do some bird photography and enjoy the weather and rum.

St. Lucia is only 27 miles (43.2 km) long and 14 miles (22.4 km) wide. The Atlantic Ocean sits off its eastern shore, while the beaches of the west coast owe their beauty to the Caribbean Sea. The population is only 180,000 of which 50,000 live in and around the capital Castries.

My brother has a wonderful split-level home called the Birdcage up in Reduit Rise overlooking Rodney Bay in the north of the island.

The wealth in the country mainly is generated by an influx of foreign tourists (around 2 million of them!!) who arrive between January until May. Unfortunately, this does not make this a wealthy country and their roads and services reflect this. For example, it takes over an hour and a half to drive from Rodney Bay to Vieux Fort in the south where the international airport is located. This distance by road is 73 kms of pot-holed horror down to Castries, then through the mountains to get to the south.

Once you are away from the hustle and bustle of the small towns and villages that are overcrowded with traffic the forests are peaceful & quiet and home to a wonderful array of birds. I managed five trips into these forests with my guide Adams Touissant and whilst I took many photos, some of the major species eluded me – good excuse to go back.

But all was not lost as back at the Birdcage my Humming-bird Feeders attracted the three species on the island every 5 minutes all through the day. I used to spend my breakfast time sitting on the balcony taking shots as they came to feed. I also enjoyed sun downer sessions with a supply of Rum & Coke to go with the photography. On this trip I had bought minimal camera gear (for me) with only one camera body (Canon R6) & two lenses (Canon RF 24-105mm & Canon RF 100-500mm plus the Canon RF 1.4 Extender).

All in all, I spent 9 weeks in St Lucia and even managed to miss my original flight out!!! First time ever in my life have a I missed a flight from not reading my schedule correctly. This was a relatively inexpensive mistake and it could have been worse if I was not staying with my brother. Maybe it was sub-conscious desire to not put up with nearly three days it takes to get back home again.

I had a fantastic time and thoroughly enjoyed myself but I am also pleased to be home as there are many more birds for me to photograph in Australia.
