# 18 - Southern Cross Station Window Refle by Glenn Rose - Accepted

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - Lots of interesting photographs pop up in public places, and this is one such - this maker has seen something reflected in a train window and has capitalised on it well by using a frame within a frame. Unfortunately, it is a little soft in focus.

# 17 - Street Protest: Not Interested by Pamela Milliken - Accepted

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - Although the boy in the scene is clear and sharp the small amount of street background is not really strong enough to qualify as a street scene. If putting this into another competition I would suggest cropping heavily at the left side to create a portrait. Otherwise, exposure and sharpness are well handled.

# 16 - Posed by William Cleverly - Accepted

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - I think this is more about these lovely ladies being photographed than a street scene as such, as the people posing are the real focus of this scene.

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - Although the people are very clear and sharp, I feel it is a pity the whole scene is not sharp, as the composition, lighting and exposure all work well.

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - Although a well seen image, I feel that the building dominates the scene too much for it to be a good street scene. Exposure, lighting and sharpness are fine, but the scene is a little crooked.

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - I feel that the large area of cobbled pavement needs cropping down a lot - This would give much more emphasis to the little lad in the scene. Good lighting and exposure and reasonably sharp.

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - This maker has done well to capture this person determinably striding along in the street, even though nothing of the street can be seen.

Judges Comment: Lin Richards - This is a powerful and poignant image of a scene which we see all too often these days of people sleeping rough. The composition is great, as is the exposure and sharpness.
