### **Nature Competition**

Please note the definition for Nature for 2025 has been reviewed and is not so restrictive in its rules as it has previously been.

Here is the revised definition:

Species of undomesticated fauna and uncultivated flora, weather events, geological features, wild land and natural water forms. Artistic camera techniques may be used. Post- production techniques may be used, but where it creatively alters appearances, then enter the images into open competitions. Undomesticated fauna in an Open Zoo is permissible, however any appearance of captivation by man is to be kept to a minimum. i.e. the animal appears in an open free environment.



### **Competition Secretaries Words of Wisdom**

Here are some images from our members that are using the back lit technique to great advantage. I hope you find them inspiring to go out and find your subjects for the upcoming Back Lighting/Back Lit competition.

The makers of these images can talk about them briefly at the meeting.

**BACK LIGHT/BACK LIGHTING:** Is an image in which the main source of illumination comes from behind the subject as opposed to the front or sides. Such lighting does not preclude the use of other secondary light sources from the camera-side of the subject. Backlit can include Rim Lighting - the effect usually hides details, causes a stronger contrast between light and dark, creates silhouettes and emphasizes lines and shapes.

Thanks to Michelle, Woolie, and our stars Narmi and Indi!








